He provided an in-depth overview of the risk factors, common causes, and various treatment modalities for peptic ulcers. The session was highly engaging, enhanced by video demonstrations of laparoscopic surgical procedures. The third session began around 12:00 PM with a presentation titled **"THE DIGESTIVE DETECTIVES – Tools and Tests for Gut Function"** by Prof. Dr. K. Rekha, MD, Vice Principal (i/c) and Professor & Head of the Department of Biochemistry, Government Medical College, Virudhunagar. The session focused on various gut function tests, detailing their procedures and clinical significance.

Post-lunch, the session resumed at 2:00 PM with the main on-stage quiz, *GUT FEST* – *The Quest to Test Your Gutz*, featuring the top six colleges competing for the coveted rolling shield. The quiz comprised ten rounds, including Functional Anatomy, Reasoning Out, History, Buzzer Round, Hidden Identity, Rush or Relax, Clinical Scenarios, Multiple Select Questions, Recent Advances, and Rapid Fire. An interactive audience round also took place, with enthusiastic participation from all attendees. After a thrilling tie-breaker, Kilpauk Medical College emerged victorious. The valedictory function followed, featuring a prize distribution ceremony that honoured the top 10 colleges, as well as winners of the audience and Instagram quizzes.
